

Kinga Firlej - Kubica was born in Łódź. She had begun piano studies at Primary School of Music in Łódź and had continued musical education at Secondary School of Music in Łódź. She obtained her distinguished diploma under the tutation of Małgorzata Wronko in 1997. Since that year she had been studying at Academy of Music in Łódź as a student of prof. Tadeusz Chmielewski. She graduated with distinction from the Academy of Music in Łódź with master of art degree in piano playing in 2002.

She has been employed as an doktor in piano department at the Academy of Music in Lodz since October 2011.

Kinga Firlej - Kubica has appeared on the stages in Poland (Warsaw, Wroclaw, Łódź, Cracow, Szczecin, Katowice) playing with orchestras, as a soloist and a chamber music player in duo or trio. She also has given concerts abroad : in Germany, France, Holland, Lithuania and China (2004, where she has made the TV recordings).

During piano masterclasses she worked with Bernard Ringeissen , Lazar Berman , Rudolf Buchbinder, Wiktor Mierzanow, Halina Czerny – Stefańska, Aleksiej Orlovietsky , Brenno Ambrosini, Jean - Paul Sevilla.

She has participated as an accompanist in many international music courses, including those in Krzyżowa (2005), Zamość (2006 - 2009) and Myślibórz (since 2009).

Since 2007 she has been performing with Wojciech Kubica in piano duo, and since 2006 - with Janos Balint and Ewelina Zawiaślak in flute trio.

In 2001 Kinga Firlej - Kubica had recorded audio CD together with cellist – Dominik Połośki containing chamber music (J.Brahms and R.Schumann pieces) for polish recording company – DUX. The CD was nominated to FRYDERYK award in 2002. In 2015 pianist recorded audio CD with flutist Olga Leonkiewicz with Fantaisies by Paul Taffanel also for DUX. The last CD "Flash Flutes", recorded together with flutists Ewelina Zawiaślak and Janos Balint for Ars Sonora, was released in 2016.

She has made many recordings for the radio and TV.
